


Most of the world's population lives in large urban agglomerations that create a separation between natural and human worlds








Going beyond human egocentrism







Grasping the temporal evolutionary process restores the sense of the grandeur of the geological phenomenon and redefines in humans the perception of their position, their influence and necessity in the system of terrestrial relations, highlighting the inconsistency of their egocentrism.


Overcoming an ontological fracture







In geotourism the geological element, by anthropic intervention, can become a human artefact without this implying denying its intrinsic natural character.



The geoethical value of geotourism





Geotourism is also the tool **to** understand human **ambivalence**, which on the one hand manifests itself as an inevitable anthropocentrism of species, on the other as awareness of the ecological noncentrality of the humans in the great cosmic architecture. Moreover, it allows the geotourist to reach a state of awareness that is not content with feeding on contemplative intellectual and/or aesthetic enjoyment, but through the aesthetic pleasure linked to the geotourist destination goes in search of that sense of individual responsibility capable of triggering the inner energy to effect a paradigm shift of the human-nature nexus.
